November 1: The Stamp Act, the first direct internal tax levied on American colonists by the British Parliament, goes into effect and is vehemently opposed by the colonists, who insist that as Englishmen, they can be taxed only by their consent.(1765).

November 10: The U.S. Marine Corps is founded as the Continental Marines, with the mission of conducting ship-to-ship fighting, providing shipboard security and discipline enforcement, and assisting in landing forces. It has served in nearly every conflict in U.S. history (1775).

November 11: At the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, German leaders sign the armistice ending World War I, known at the time as the Great War (1918).

November 11: The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery is dedicated 3 years after the end of WW I (1921).

November 13: The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is dedicated in Washington, D.C. (1982).

November 17: Congress convenes in Washington, D.C., for the first time (1800).

November 19: Lincoln delivers the "Gettysburg Address" at the dedication of the National Cemetery at the site of the battle (1863).

November 25: Nearly 3 months after the Treaty of Paris, ending the American Revolution, is signed, the last British soldiers withdraw from New York City, the last British military position in the United States (1783).



France Brings Perfect Combination to Revolutionary War

On 4 July 1776, Thomas Jefferson's Declaration of Independence was signed in Philadelphia. The news caused quite a stir at the French Court; the text gave the new American states the possibility of entering into alliances. France's aid was to be gradual and decisive.

It began with arms, munitions, officers to train American troops, and money. Support intensified after the signing of the "Treaty of Amity and Commerce" on 6 February 1778. France became the first nation to officially recognize the independent United States as a country, separate from Britain. The treaty also set up a trade agreement between the two nations.
